Eligibility Requirements: Available to individuals ages 12 to 21 years old

Types of Services: Direct legal services in all civil areas including:

- Family law

Additional Information: In order to use The Door's services, you must become a Door member. Membership is free and requires making an appointment for an interview. An appointment can be made for legal services and membership services at the same time, or an appointment can be made for membership immediately after the legal appointment.
